


#### **BUILDING BRAVE VOICES CHALLENGE**

#### **CLASSROOM CHRONICLES**

It's been an exciting and productive week across all our classes! Students have been exploring creativity, problem-solving, and real-world connections in every subject. Here's a look at what we've been working on:

This week, we focused on Science and Engineering Practices 4–6: Analyzing and Interpreting Data, Using Mathematics and Computational Thinking, and Constructing Explanations and Designing Solutions. These practices are used by scientists in every field, so it's a great opportunity for students to apply them and see how science connects to real life!

In Business Communications, students are learning how clear and respectful communication leads to success in school, work, and everyday life. Through interactive lessons and self-reflection, they are practicing verbal, nonverbal, and written communication while exploring how listening, tone, and body language shape understanding. These lessons help students build teamwork, professionalism, and confidence in expressing their ideas.









#### **CLASSROOM CHRONICLES**

In Digital Literacy, students are exploring the concept of the Digital Divide—the gap between those who have reliable access to technology and those who do not. Through real-world examples, group discussions, and hands-on activities, they are learning how factors like cost, geography, and digital literacy affect education, work, and civic life. The goal is to build empathy and awareness of the importance of equal access to technology.

Our middle school mathematicians explored the concept of functions using "Guess My Rule" activities and number machines! Students learned that a function gives one output for each input—just like a vending machine. This fun and interactive lesson helped them strengthen their foundational algebra skills. Meanwhile, our high school classes continued their Desmos Art Project, using equations to create designs over images. Students practiced adjusting equations to control shapes and lines, discovering how algebra can be both creative and powerful!

For Social Studies classes, we kicked off the week with a spooky lesson on the history of ghost stories, exploring what these tales can teach us about cultures from the past and present. Then, we shifted to current events, learning about government shutdowns—their causes, effects, and impact on daily life. Students made great connections between history, culture, and current issues!

In English, students tapped into their creativity by adding spooky and suspenseful elements to their writing. They experimented with tone, setting, and descriptive language to bring their stories to life!

#### **CLASSROOM CHRONICLES**

Students are learning how to ask and answer questions at a higher language level, building on grammar and vocabulary rules from earlier in the year. They're becoming more confident in holding short conversations and expressing themselves in Spanish.

In Art, students revisited the foundational principles of design—line, shape, color, balance, and texture—to strengthen their artistic technique. These skills serve as the building blocks for more complex projects to come!

This week in PE, students examined the militarystyle workouts trending in fitness today. They analyzed which exercises build cardio, strength, and flexibility, and reflected on how these workouts compare to their own fitness goals.

Last but certainly not least in Senior Skills, students continued their discussions about balancing and managing high-pressure situations. Through real-world scenarios and reflection, they are learning strategies to stay calm, focused, and effective in challenging environments.

An ongoing list of haunted houses, hay rides, and seasonal events across Illinois. Use it to find low-cost options near you.




#### Boo! at the Zoo - October 4-31





# Get Help Reducing Your Heating and Electric Bills!





#### **Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program**

LIHEAP programs offer heating and electricity assistance to income eligible households.

Apply for LIHEAP during your household's eligibility period.



#### Priority Period 1 October 1, 2025

- Older adults (60 years +).
- Person(s) with a disability.
- Families with children 5 & under.
- Disconnected and imminent disconnection households.

#### **Priority Period 2**

November 1, 2025 -August 15, 2026, or until funds are exhausted.

- All income eligible Cook County residents.
- Including all groups from Priority Period 1.

#### Eligibility Requirements

- Social Security Number or ITIN for all household members.
   Individuals without an SSN/ITIN can still apply.
- Current utility bills or lease if heat is included in the rent.
- Proof of 30-day income for all household members 18 and older.





#### Período de Prioridad 1

1 de octubre de 2025

- Familias con niños de 5 años o menores.
- Hogares desconectados o con desconexión inminente.

#### Período de Prioridad 2

1 de noviembre de 2025 – 15 de agosto de 2026, o hasta que se agoten los fondos.

- Todos los residentes del Condado de Cook que cumplan con los requisitos de ingresos.
- Incluye a todos los grupos del Período de Prioridad 1.

#### Requisitos de elegibilidad

- Número de Seguro Social (SSN) o ITIN para todos los miembros del hogar. Las personas sin SSN/ITIN aún pueden solicitar.
- Facturas actuales de servicios públicos o contrato de arrendamiento si la calefacción está incluida en la renta.
- Comprobante de ingresos de los últimos 30 días para todos los miembros del hogar de 18 años o más.
